The Peer Ministry Team (PMT) at St. Thomas Aquinas University Parish represents Catholic students at the University of Arkansas and Catholic Campus Ministry as an official Registered Student Organization (RSO). PMT members are the leaders of our faith community, helping to envision, execute and invigorate our ministries. PMT reps must be faithful, prayerful Catholics willing to take a leadership role in St. Thomas ministries. The team will work closely with the pastor and the campus ministry staff to embody the six principles of campus ministry put forth by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops: *forming the faith community, appropriating the faith, forming the Christian conscience, educating for justice, facilitating personal development, and developing leaders*.

The 2018-2019 Peer Ministry Team will offer particular leadership in the areas of Faith, Service, and Community. In addition to planning and leading campus ministry events and activities, PMT members will be responsible for attending monthly meetings with their team. PMT leaders also *will be responsible for attending* fall and spring planning retreats to prepare for the semester. If selected as an RSO officer, you will be responsible for meeting the requirements of the university and keep our faculty advisors informed of program events. Also, attend a short meeting for RSO officers before summer.
